What can we say about February in Iowa? In mixed company...at church. Better keep it brief. What I can say about February in Iowa is that it always provides ample opportunity to go inside, be inside, and preferably stay inside. While I'm talking about physical space, I of course am inferring Spiritual movement as well.

This is a season in the church year to *journey in*. It's a good time to explore what exactly we mean by the *journey in*. It's the one piece of our mission that might lack clarity. Unlike the *journey up* which is somewhat obviously about growing in relationship with God, and the *journey out*, which compels us outward to love and serve others. The *journey in* is a move toward what exactly? The undiscovered country? The inner landscape? The relationships that are closest to us within our own family, life and church community? Yes.

The *journey in* can be an exciting journey of self-discovery, personal growth and introspection. It can be our greatest journey yet. We might be like the pilgrim who said, “*I went looking for God and found myself. I went looking for myself and found God.*” This discovery in particular highlights the importance of the inner journey. You just never know what you will discover on such a journey. So, take some time this cold and sometimes brutal winter to spend some time “inside.” Spend some time in prayer and meditation like centering prayer (Wednesdays, noon). Walk a labyrinth (Ask Tom Small or Hal Rusk about local options for labyrinths). Spend some time following the lines of a Mandala toward the center of a sacred circle (Ask me about my Mandalas). Most of all, learn to enjoy the company of your soul. May your journey inward be rewarding and enlightening this season. Peace, Paul
