“I learn by going where I have to go . . .”

As winter has finally, though mildly, shown itself here in Iowa, I find that I’m finally in the mood to prepare for Christmas and the wintery season of Epiphany that follows. I’ve been spending some time with this poem by Theodore Roethke, “The Waking.” So many of its words and images have me thinking about this season, especially the season of Epiphany which I often think of as a “wake up” season for the church.

Epiphany is that season following Christmas in the church’s liturgical calendar. The Magi and their journey to are the principle character they follow is the Christ child, the Magi, and the main figure of Epiphany. It seems to be a time of light, enlightenment and journey.

About the Magi, Matthew tells us, “Having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.” So, it’s about waking, but it’s also about dreaming. Listening for guidance and going where we have to go. Learning all the way.
